Orenda Canoe Club History

- In 1977 a group of volunteers began the Orenda Canoe Club. That first year they operated with two mini training kayaks, two fiberglass C4s, and a war canoe recovered from the bottom of Lake Banook. With no Club House, the Club operated out of the local Community Center and with no motor boat available, coaching for smaller boats took place from the shore.
 - From 1978 through 1981, the Club operations grew with boats obtained from other well-established clubs within the province
 - In 1983 the Club was incorporated as a non-profit organization
 - In 1985 volunteers donated their time, labour, and services to build a Club House that was further expanded in 2000
 - In 1993, an adult paddling program (Masters) was introduced
- Orenda has produced athletes of local, national, and international stature. Some highlights: Canadian National Champions three consecutive years; four Olympians- Steve Giles ('92, '96, '00 and '04), Leslie-Anne Young ('92), Glen Girard ('92), Peter Giles ('96); Atlantic Division Bantam Champs and Atlantic Division Champions, Canada Games members and Canadian National team members, record setting athletes and Burgee wins.
- *From humble beginnings with second hand equipment acquired from other clubs to producing athletes of national and international calibre, Orenda remains community focused and strives to produce confident, goal-oriented people with a life long love of physical fitness and wellness.*
